## Upcoming U.S. Citizen Services Visits (Cont. from Page 1)

To support applicants who are unable to travel to the U.S. Embassy in Hanoi or the U.S. Consulate General in Ho Chi Minh City, the ACS unit (<http://bit.ly/acsoutreach>) offers periodic consular visits to several provinces and cities.

No appointments are necessary. Consulate officials will offer notarial services, and U.S. citizens will be able to apply for U.S. passports. **Officials will not be interviewing for Consular Reports of Birth Abroad, and visa and immigration services will not be provided.** Only the services listed will be available during the visits.

**Please be sure to bring ALL required documents and the items listed below to our outreach sites to prevent processing delays:**

- **Passport renewal:** Bring a **photocopy** of **ALL** official documents (passports, birth certificates and CRBAs). Passports that have no empty pages must be renewed as we no longer add additional pages.
- **Notarial service:** **Bring the correct affidavit form.** If you'd like to complete your affidavit in advance, our forms are available at : <http://bit.ly/acsnotary>; otherwise you may also obtain the physical forms when you arrive.

# Typhoon Season 2019-2020

Typhoon season in the South Pacific Ocean begins on November 1, 2019 and ends on April 30, 2020. All U.S. Citizens traveling or residing in Vietnam may enroll in the Smart Traveler Enrollment Program ([STEP](#)) to receive safety messages and other travel information. During the approach of a typhoon you should monitor the [U.S. Joint Typhoon Warning Center](#) and the Vietnam National Center for Hydro-Meteorological Forecasting (<http://kttv.gov.vn/KttvsiteE/en-US/2/index.html> (English) or <http://kttv.gov.vn/Kttvsite/vi-VN/1/index.html> (Vietnamese))



You should also have an emergency plan in place before the approach of a typhoon, as even areas far from the coastline can experience dangerous winds, tornadoes, mudslides, and floods. Please consider the following precautionary measures prior to the advance of a typhoon:

- Locate shelter in your area and follow all official instructions from local authorities, including evacuation if ordered.
- Carry your travel documents at all times (i.e., copies of your U.S. passport, birth certificate, picture ID's, etc.) or secure them in a safe, waterproof location.
- Secure loose outdoor items (roofing material, windows (coverings), doors, debris (trash), etc.).
- Fill up your vehicle, generator, and water tanks.
- Check and charge radios.
- Charge cell phones and carry your charger, including portable chargers available for most cell phone models at many convenience stores and electronic shops.
- Have bottled water; make ice.
- Gather flashlights, tools, and first aid supplies.
- Have fresh batteries, candles, matches, water, groceries (canned and/or dry foods), and pet supplies.
- Pack an adequate supply of first-aid materials and prescription medications.
- Let your family and office know how you plan to weather the storm, especially those family members in the United States. Keep them updated regarding your location and well-being.

# Services for U.S. Citizens

The American Citizen Services (ACS) Units of the U.S. Embassy in Hanoi and the Consulate General in Ho Chi Minh City use a service-by-appointment system. Please visit our website at: <https://vn.usembassy.gov/acs> to make an appointment to apply for a U.S. passport, a Consular Report of Birth Abroad (CRBA), as well as for notary services.

Those with genuine emergencies, such as the death, arrest, or life threatening illness of a U.S. citizen, can appear on a walk-in basis from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday to Friday (except holidays) or call us any time at (84-24) 3850-5000 (Hanoi) and (84-28) 3520-4200 (Ho Chi Minh City).

Every day we have a number of no-shows for routine services. If you make an appointment for passport or notarial services and find you cannot keep it, please log back into the appointment system and cancel the appointment so that the appointment slot will be available to another client. If you forget your appointment password, please contact us at: <https://vn.usembassy.gov/acs-contact>. If you have a CRBA appointment and find you cannot keep it, please send an email to: [HanoiCRBAAppt@state.gov](mailto:HanoiCRBAAppt@state.gov) for Hanoi and [VietnamCRBAAppt@state.gov](mailto:VietnamCRBAAppt@state.gov) for Ho Chi Minh City to request cancellation and rescheduling.

If you are only picking up passports, you do not need to make an appointment and can walk in for assistance between the hours listed below:

- ◆ **U.S. Embassy in Hanoi:** From 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Thursday (except holidays)
- ◆ **U.S. Consulate General in Ho Chi Minh City:** From 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m., Wednesday only (except holidays)

If you are submitting additional information related to a Consular Report of Birth Abroad case, please send an email to [HanoiCRBAAppt@state.gov](mailto:HanoiCRBAAppt@state.gov) for Hanoi and [VietnamCRBAAppt@state.gov](mailto:VietnamCRBAAppt@state.gov) for Ho Chi Minh City, with the subject line: "The additional required documentation – [NAME OF YOUR CHILD]", we will then set up a date for you to come in the Embassy or the Consulate for a review of your additional documents. Each child will need a separate appointment.

Our office will respond to your inquiries as soon as possible. You may want to visit the Department of State's travel website for more information on **entry, exit, and foreign visa requirements**.

# Services for U.S. Citizens (Cont.)

**ALL APPOINTMENTS ARE FREE (no cost) FOR U.S. CITIZEN SERVICES**, including passports, notary services, and Consular Reports of Birth Abroad. The website also has detailed instructions about service costs and required documents/procedures for each service.

## **ATTENTION:**

Do not bring laptop computers, iPads, tablets, and other large electronic devices to the U.S. Embassy or Consulate. You may not enter the building with these devices. **You also may not leave these devices at the security checkpoint.**

You are not allowed to enter the U.S. Embassy or Consulate while carrying any of the following battery-operated or electronic devices such as:

- Mobile phones
- Digital watches
- Compact Cameras
- Audio recorders
- Portable music players



Please note that these small electronic devices will be kept at the security checkpoint when you enter the U.S. Embassy/Consulate building, and returned to you when your business is completed.

Large shoulder bags or purses, travel bags, backpacks, briefcases, and suitcases are considered prohibited items and therefore NOT allowed inside the Embassy/Consulate premises. The limit size for bags is: 35 cm (height) x 20 cm (width) x 40 cm (length). Unfortunately, if your bag is bigger than the size limit, you will not be allowed to bring it into the U.S. Embassy or Consulate. Please plan accordingly! Bring a small bag that can be carried by hand to store your personal belongings.

# New Regulations

## VIETNAM WORK PERMIT FOR FOREIGN LABOR



Decree No. 143/2018/ND-CP on compulsory social insurance for foreign employees in Vietnam came into effect from December 1, 2018. **Please Note:** The issuance of work permits in Vietnam falls solely under the purview of the Ministry of Labor – Invalids and Social Affairs. Therefore, you should contact the office of your respective provincial Department of Labor – Invalids and Social Affairs for official guidance in case you need further assistance.

# Electronic Payments

## International Direct Deposit

International Direct Deposit (IDD) for U.S. federal benefit payments is now available in Vietnam. With this method, your U.S. Social Security payments will be sent electronically to your Vietnam bank account. It will usually be in your account shortly after the regular payment date. This is the safest way of receiving your benefits.

The U.S. Treasury Department can make payments to almost all banks within the country. SSA does not have a list of host-country banks. In the rare event that a bank is not listed, SSA office will notify the client who will need to open an account at another bank.

It is important to note that the U.S. Treasury Department can only make payments in Vietnamese Dong. Therefore, please ensure that the payment account is in Vietnamese Dong and not U.S. Dollars. If your address changes, you must inform the Social Security Administration (If you return to live in the U.S., IDD will cease.)

**IMPORTANT INFORMATION - PLEASE READ CAREFULLY**

The information you give on this form is confidential. We need the information to send your U.S. Social Security payments electronically to your Vietnam bank account.

**WHEN YOU WILL RECEIVE YOUR DIRECT DEPOSIT PAYMENTS**

You will receive your payment through the Vietnam banking system and will usually be in your bank account shortly after the regular payment date. With direct deposit, you will have immediate access to your money. This is the safest way of receiving your benefits.

**INFORMATION ABOUT CURRENCY CONVERSION:**

With direct deposit, your U.S. Social Security payment is automatically converted to Vietnamese Dong (if applicable) at the daily international exchange rate before being deposited to your account.

**\*\*SPECIAL NOTICE TO JOINT ACCOUNT HOLDERS\*\***

If you have a joint account with a person who receives Social Security payments, and that person dies, you must immediately contact your bank and the Social Security Administration or the Federal Benefits Unit in your area. You must return to Social Security any payments deposited into a joint account after the death of a beneficiary.

**IF YOUR ADDRESS CHANGES:**

If your address changes, you **must** inform the Federal Benefits Unit or the Social Security Administration. Your payments may stop if the Social Security Administration needs to contact you and cannot find your location.

**CHANGING BANKS OR BANK ACCOUNTS:**

If you change your bank or your account, you must notify one of the following offices:

You may need to fill out a new Direct Deposit sign-up form. **Do not close your old account until payments have started coming to your new account.**

**Privacy Act Statement Collection and Use of Personal Information**

Section 205(a) of the Social Security Act, as amended, allows us to collect this information. Furnishing us this information is voluntary. However, failing to provide all or part of the information may prevent you from receiving benefit payments through foreign financial institutions.

We will use the information you provide to process benefit payments with your financial institution. We may also share your information for the following purposes, called routine uses:

- To the Department of State and its agents for administering the Act in foreign countries through facilities and services of that agency; and
- To third party contacts where necessary to establish or verify information provided by representative payees or payee applicants.

In addition, we may share this information in accordance with the Privacy Act and other Federal laws. For example, where authorized, we may use and disclose this information in computer matching programs, in which our records are compared with other records to establish or verify a person's eligibility for Federal benefit programs and for repayment of incorrect or delinquent debts under these programs.

# Air Quality Monitors in Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh City

The U.S. Embassy and U.S. Consulate have installed air quality monitors to measure PM 2.5 particulates as an indication of the air quality. For more details on air quality index, please follow the link to the Environmental Protection Agency's [Air Now](#) website. The AQI can be observed either by clicking on the location on the map, or by selecting Hanoi or Ho Chi Minh City in the "Select a City" option on the upper right part of the page. The page provides AQI over the last 24 hour period as well as pollutant concentration and a downloadable historical document.

Please note that citywide analysis cannot be done with data from a single monitor. This data provides an accurate measure of the air quality in the section of each city close to the location of the monitor. The Vietnamese Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment also provides air quality data for Hanoi. You can view this information at <http://www.cem.gov.vn/>.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has developed a formula to convert PM 2.5 readings into an air quality index (AQI) value that can help inform health-related decisions. Meanings of AQI numerical values can be seen in the chart below. For more information on AQI and how it is calculated, please click [here](#).

Air Quality Index Levels of Health Concern	Numerical Value	Meaning
<b>Good</b>	0 to 50	Air quality is considered satisfactory, and air pollution poses little or no risk
<b>Moderate</b>	51 to 100	Air quality is acceptable; however, for some pollutants there may be a moderate health concern for a very small number of people who are unusually sensitive to air pollution.
<b>Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups</b>	101 to 150	Members of sensitive groups may experience health effects. The general public is not likely to be affected.
<b>Unhealthy</b>	151 to 200	Everyone may begin to experience health effects; members of sensitive groups may experience more serious health effects.
<b>Very Unhealthy</b>	201 to 300	Health warnings of emergency conditions. The entire population is more likely to be affected.
<b>Hazardous</b>	301 to 500	Health alert: everyone may experience more serious health effects.

## Attention U.S. citizens!

Beginning January 1, 2017, the IRS will require that all (Individual Taxpayer Identification Numbers (ITINs) not used on a federal tax return at least once in the last three years will no longer be valid for use on a tax return. ## Vietnam will allow foreigners to change visa status without leaving the country, as of July 1, 2020

According to the revised Law on Entry, Exit, Transit and Residence of Foreigners, which was passed by lawmakers in November, foreign visitors to Vietnam can apply for a change of visa purpose under a number of particular conditions.

Visitors who can prove they are investors or representatives of foreign organizations that make legal investments in Vietnam will be allowed to switch their purpose of visit during the stay in the country. Family members of such visa holders will have the same advantage.

Foreign workers who receive job offers in Vietnam or enter the country on e-visas will be able to change their visa status as long as they have a valid work permit or the confirmation that they are eligible for one.

## Request for an Emergency Passport

If you have urgent travel plans, we can assist you by issuing an emergency passport. Such passports have limited validity and cannot be extended (validity depends on the case, but maximum validity is for one year). Passport holders are required to exchange their limited -validity passport for a full -validity photo-digitized passport upon completion of their emergency travel, either through passport facilities in the U.S. or at U.S. Embassies and Consulates abroad.

**Please be advised that some countries, such as Indonesia, may have restrictions on travelers entering on a limited-validity passport.** If your next destination is outside the United States, please review the entry/exit restrictions for your destination country by visiting the U.S. Department of State travel page at : <https://travel.state.gov/content/passports/en/country.html>.
