This project, therefore, argues that China's strategic exploitation of its bilateral relations with regional countries, and the dynamics of the Southeast Asian politics play an important role in influencing ASEAN members' attitude towards regional collaboration on tackling the disputes.

Also, the project assesses the ASEAN Member States' policy reaction to U.S. re-engagement to deal with "China threat" and examine their strategic objectives toward US regional policy through which crucial policy recommendations will be made for Vietnam - U.S. relations in face of China.
